'Magpies and Bombers fly high for Farrer League Flag'



The stage is set for Saturday's Farrer League grand final at Robertson Oval.

The high-flying Marrar Bombers, who won the 2022 Minor Premiership after losing just one game during the season, take on the ever-improving The Rock-Yerong Creek (TRYC) Magpies.

It will be no surprise to see Marrar enter the decider as red-hot favourites, with Shane 'Sparks' Lenon's team absolutely firing in season 2022.

After finishing top of the table, they won their way into the grand final with a dominant 11.9 (75) to 5.7 (37) win over East Wagga-Koorringal in the qualifying final.

TRYC co-coach Brad Aiken, who shares the job with Heath Russell, had the upmost respect for Marrar and their coaching counterpart leading into Saturday's decider.

"They are a good team and Sparks is a smart man," Aiken said.

"I have been lucky enough to play under him, and as a coach, he has the runs on the board, because he has been there and done it, and he will have them prepared to the minute.

"They have been the best all year, but he knows our best footy can match theirs, but he is a good motivator, and we will have to be at our absolute best to beat them on Saturday."

Playing in the 2022 grand final almost completes a full turnaround for the Magpies, who finished the 2019 season in second-last on the competition ladder.

Aiken was proud to see his Magpies flying high, and he confirmed the coaching duo would be in charge again in 2023.

"If you look back, the club was struggling with poor attendance at training and they couldn't get recruits, and it was a tough period for everyone involved," Aiken said.

"To see the boys in a grand final and the club doing so well is very rewarding for Heath and I, and we have signed on again next year, because we have a vision to keep the club rolling along and high up the ladder.

"Leading into this year, our aim at the start of the year was to play finals with both grades, and we ticked that box, and we now get the opportunity to play in a grand final and you couldn't ask for much more."
The Magpies have taken a unique road to the grand final, losing to East Wagga-Koorinal Hawks 8-7 (55) to 7.7 (49) in the qualifying semi-final.

TRYC hit back though and belted North Wagga by 28 points in the elimination final before getting revenge over the Hawks in the preliminary final, winning by 47 points.

Aiken believes their first-round finals loss sent them on a path to the grand final, with since TRYC firing on all six cylinders.

"That game against East Wagga in the first week of finals; that game put us in the position we are in at the moment," Aiken said.
"I know we lost, but we got our physicality back, and we had no choice, because we could either shy away from the contest or have a crack, and while we didn't win, we played really well, and it set us up for what we have seen the last fortnight.

"We have come out and played out style of footy since then, and we've kicked nearly 100 points the last two weeks, and it shows we are taking our chances and playing well."

When asked if the Magpies can win the Farrer League flag, Aiken believes so, but he said it would be a huge challenge for his side.

"It is going to be a tough job," Aiken said.

"Marrar are fresh, they are a good side, and they play good footy for long periods at a time.

"We will give it our all, and if our best is good enough than great, but if they can match us at our best and win, they deserve it.

"Either way, it should be a good game and I'm looking forward to it."
