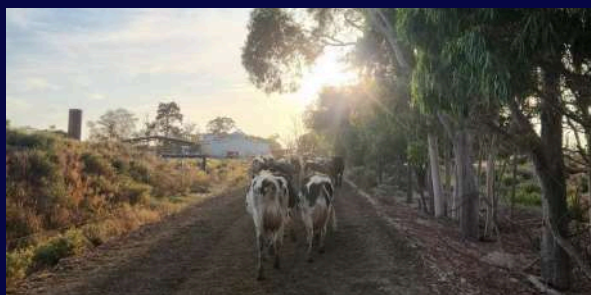

'Aiken chasing the final piece of the puzzle'



BRAD Aiken has achieved just about all there is to achieve in Riverina football.

He's a 10-time premiership player, a five-time league medallist and dominated football across both the Riverina and Farrer Leagues up until he was close to 40.

When it comes to Riverina football the name Aiken is synonymous with success.

There is one thing missing from his football CV however, that being the title of premiership coach.

After four misses on grand final day in the past, Aiken will get another chance to add the missing piece of the puzzle as co-coach of The Rock-Yerong Creek in Saturday's Farrer League grand final.

A candid Aiken admitted a premiership as coach is the one thing missing from completing his career in football.

"It is, to be honest. It is," Aiken said.

"It's the one thing I've wanted to do and it doesn't matter where it was, I suppose, it was something that I've always wanted to accomplish as a coach.

"I tried to do it as a playing coach and it didn't eventuate and it wasn't meant to be, I guess.

"Now I've been striving for it as a non-playing coach and to do it with Heath (Russell), he's become a pretty close mate, we go away together and on family holidays so it will be pretty special if we get the chance."

Aiken and Russell have proven the perfect coaching partnership.

The Magpies players have long often referred to the pair as 'Mum and Dad' given how the pair both bring different strengths and quirks to the relationship that come together to complement each other effectively.

Russell, while probably lesser known in football circles, brings his own impressive background.

A premiership player at Narrandera, Russell has twice coached Goulburn Swans to premiership success.

He returned to the region in 2017 and ended up at the Magpies by chance after striking up a relationship with Aiken and Tim Sullivan through the Giants Academy.

The pair led TRYC to last year's grand final only to be blown off the park early on their way to a 39-point defeat.

The pair are realists and recognise they weren't good enough last year. But they're back in 2024, better-placed and armed with the lessons learned from that day.

"Obviously it wasn't to be last year, Heath and I are pretty realistic about it, we weren't good enough and hopefully we've done everything possible this year to give our boys and the club enough the opportunity to win the ultimate but you don't get nothing for free unfortunately," Aiken said.

"Things can turn on its head pretty quick but I think the boys have done everything possible, and the club has too, to give ourselves that opportunity and that's all we've given ourselves."

Aiken knows too well that's all they've earned so far.

"He coached Collingullie to three consecutive grand final defeats during the mid-2000s, two of which came at the hands of Northern Jets, the team the Magpies meet in Saturday's decider.

If Aiken was a little nervous or even conscious of his grand final record as coach heading this week, no one told his wife, Gemma.

"My wife actually said to me the other day funnily enough, Chloe was there and we were talking about footy and Gemma said this will be your fifth grand final that you've coached and you haven't won one before have you?," Aiken recalled.

"And I'm like, you're right, but I wasn't really thinking about it like that but thanks for reminding me.

"She didn't mean anything by it but it was funny how she put it"

TRYC go into this grand final as favourite. They've lost just one game of 17 all year, and beaten the Jets on both occasions.

But Aiken isn't taking anything for granted and is making sure they've dotted all the i's and crossed their t's as he looks to complete his career and return TRYC to the top of the Farrer League.

"We're focused on ourselves," he said.

"We know that we have to play our brand of footy. We've got to turn up. If we don't turn up in the first quarter like we did last year, it doesn't matter how good you are, if you let them get on top early, grow and get confidence, it doesn't matter what injuries you've got, you're going to be right in it."
